Uno was born and raised in a southern province of his home country in Asia. While in medical school, he heard the gospel several times and put his faith in Christ. Upon graduating from the University of Health Sciences with a degree in medicine, Uno was convicted about God's love through the Beatitudes and answered the Lord's call to full-time ministry. He has served in campus ministry, most recently as the team leader of the medical team.

AT THIS MOMENT . . .

Navigating the political and organizational challenges of international marriage, Uno and Joyce are in the process of obtaining a visa for Uno to enter the United States. While in the US, Uno hopes to complete a Master of Divinity while Joyce finishes her Doctor of Philosophy in Intercultural Studies. THE BROOKS

A congregation in Downtown Los Angeles focused on bringing people into the fellowship of God's family, building them up to Christ-like maturity, training them for their ministry in the local church, and sending them out to share the Good News all for the global glory of God.



My name is Jimmie Davidson. Before moving to California in 2012, I planted and led Highlands Fellowship in Abingdon, Virginia, for 18 years—leading it to become one of the largest SBC churches in Virginia reaching the world for Christ. I now serve as the Church Planting Catalyst Lead for California, overseeing the Church Planting Catalysts in California for Send Network. I also serve as pastor of The Brooks Church. We have seen people give their lives to Christ and follow Him in baptism.

The vision God gave me was to plant a multiethnic church in the greater LA area, reaching young urban professionals with the gospel, equipping them to fulfill God's purpose for their lives. The North American Mission Board recruited me to be a catalyst and gave me permission to plant a church bi-vocationally. I'm often drawn to areas where work is not being done and work to fill the gaps. After talking with Pastor Benny Wong I realized there was no multi-ethnic, SBC church in America's second largest city at the time. This was like a Macedonian Call.

For the first full year we were reaching our target: young, urban professionals from ages 20 to 30-something. As the church continued to grow we relocated to the Downtown Independent theater on Main Street, and began to see a mixture of young professionals and those struggling with mental illness, homelessness, and addiction. Pre-COVID-19 the church began to meet outdoors at Grand Park in front of City Hall, reaching the homeless community through sharing the gospel, weekly worship services, a meal along with training, and occasional small group meetings.

My first goal is to see a “set free church” move into DTLA to provide a church that meets the needs of this community, providing them a hand up and not just a hand out—helping them find their purpose in life. We are currently looking at set free churches in the outlying areas around LA as possibilities to offer Sunday services, and that would be a beachhead for a new church for this people group.

The second goal is to continue to reach out to the young professionals that are moving into LA from around the globe.

The costs associated with this are enormous considering renting space in DTLA that would be conducive to this people group, as well as costs related to staffing and worship teams/bands.

God's people to plant a church reaching people wherever they live. The purpose is to share the good news about Christ and help people fulfill God's purpose for their lives.

The third goal is to provide an online platform to equip leaders globally, using The Brooks as a model and empowering

Our final goal is to finish the Great Commission.


AT THIS MOMENT . . .

Currently with the COVID-19 situation, we are doing weekly Zoom calls with some of those who have the capability to connect in this way. We are also providing for our community based on their needs. For example, one of our members contracted COVID-19 while at the same time battling cancer. When he returned to his Section 8 housing, he had no AC, which caused more difficulty to breathe. The Brooks purchased an in-room AC.

Sometimes members need food, or a ride to the doctor or surgery, and The Brooks provides. One member, who was homeless, broke his leg and we provided money to stay in a hotel until he was admitted to the hospital. We have also provided face masks. In July, we provided water and food to the homeless that are located at the corner of 1st and Spring.
